ENTWINE TABLE

The Entwine Table was originally designed for an English professor in southern California. The dimensions of the top were determined by the number of diners that could be comfortably seated, six, or eight to ten in a last second dining party pinch.

Designing a solid top table is easy, but with ease comes difficulty. The weight and size of the slab would make the table exceedingly difficult to move. The solution was to break the top into four ergonomic sections. This allows two people to easily disassemble, move, and reassemble the table. Each slab floats independent of the others, they do not touch. This detail adds immense visual interest in a subtle fashion to an otherwise ordinary item.

However, the real magic of this table is in the design of the base, which I would unabashedly tout as a feat of engineering. Crafting a base that would support the four slabs wasn't difficult; crafting a base that would yield a rock solid table, that didn't shift or bounce, was.
